

Enrichments

Ideas to make scripture more fun, enjoyable or meaningful.

- Plan a reward for when goals are accomplished, like going bowling or out for ice cream
- Use transparent stickers to highlight stories
- Make or buy finger puppets of scripture characters for kids to act out stories
- Play scripture mastery “Mad Gab”
- Memorize scriptures together with games - memory, fill in the blank, take away word strips, etc.
- Sing a song, or play spiritual music before or to gather everyone together
- Use a Book of Mormon reading chart to mark off progress
- Have assignments that rotate, like a FHE chart, opening prayer, opening song, reading, summary, etc
- Fill an empty jar, add a fuzzy ball when everyone is on time, or when there’s no complaining, have a treat when jar is full
- Send out scripture in text that stood out from family reading that day or week
- Create a phone wallpaper using a design app, with a weekly scripture for family to “ponderize”
- Use flannel board printables to help tell the stories
- Create a scripture time spinner, include different categories like conference talks, videos and books of scripture, whatever the spinner lands on is the scripture time for the day.
- Fill a jar with scriptures and conference talks, each day pull a slip from the jar

- Create and keep scripture journals where you read the scriptures, take the time each day to have everyone write their thoughts about the scriptures read
- Consider including extended family members in a goal to complete the Book of Mormon over extended family time.
- Use FaceTime, Skype or even phone calls to include family members that are traveling in family scripture time.
